October 7 – 11, 2013 is the count week for the State of Ohio. During that week, the state requires a written note for all student absences. Therefore, if you call in for your child during that week, please know that a written note will be required in order for your child to be excused. You must send the note in on the day your child returns to school.

### **COLLEGE AND CAREER DAY**

College and Career Day will be held on Wednesday October 2. Freshmen and Sophomores will be learning about a variety of careers while juniors and seniors will have an opportunity to meet with college and military representatives. This is a great chance for PHS students to look at different careers and think about future choices.

### **OGT Test Dates**

The Fall administration of the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) will be given to juniors and seniors who did not pass sections of the test last spring or in previous administrations. Testing dates for Juniors and Seniors only for the OGT are October 28- November 1, 2013 with make-ups held the week of November 4 – November 8. We will not follow a delay schedule that week. All students are to be at school at the regularly scheduled time, whether they are taking a test or not. The test order for the Fall administration of the OGT is Monday: Reading, Tuesday: Math, Wednesday: Writing, Thursday: Science and Friday: Social Studies. A reminder to all, a student cannot pass the OGT without doing the written response questions on the test!

### **Attendance**

It is the law that every student is in school everyday. The Ohio Revised code dictates which absences are excused, it is not up to the school administration. We must count and correctly code all absences. Attendance is reported on our school report card and must be maintained at 94%--that would be a total of 11 days of absence per year. Students who miss 10 or more days in a grading period will fail their classes.

Parents are urged to make attendance a top priority at home. Poor attendance is an extremely hard habit to break when entering the work world. This year it is especially important for students to be at school as the law has become stricter.

### **Pride of Piqua News**

The Piqua Music Boosters invites the community to show its support for the Pride of Piqua Marching Band on Saturday October 5 at Alexander Stadium. This is the 42<sup>nd</sup> annual Piqua Marching Band Invitational. The contest begins at 5:00 and is a Mid-States Band Association sanctioned competition. The Pride of Piqua will be performing their 2013 show. Admission is \$5 per person. Enter at Tomahawk Trail and park north of the stadium or at the high school.

### **Medication at School**

All students must have a doctor's note signed by the parent in order to take <u>any</u> (over the counter or prescription) medication at school. We have the correct medication form and can fax it to your doctor. Violators of the medication policy will be suspended from school. Please refer to the student handbook for further information.

### **Student Parking**

All students must secure a parking permit from Mr. Hite or Mrs. DeMange in the Attendance Office. The cost is \$10.00. Students who do not secure a parking permit will be subject to towing at their expense. Please assist us in this security measure. Parking lot and driving rules will be followed at all times or parking privileges will be revoked. No student is to park in the front lots at any time during the school day (that includes UVCC and Edison students)!



### **Cell Phones**

Parents are reminded that cell phones are not to be in use during the school day. The only exception is when students may use their cell phone during their specific lunch period (A, B or C) only. Parents can really assist us with this issue by NOT calling and/or texting students during school hours! Ask your son or daughter what time their lunch period is and make contact during that half hour period, or before or after school. Please do not send text messages to your student, this developed into a problem last year. They cannot reply to your text during school time. Your assistance would be appreciated!

### **Interim Progress Reports**

Progress reports will be issued to students on <u>Friday</u>, <u>September 20</u>. You can access your student's class achievement record via the Internet. If you need information on accessing Progress Book from home, contact Christie Schneider in the guidance office.

### **Out of Bounds**

Students are not to be behind any portion of the stadium, at the pond or in the parking lots or corn or soy bean fields during the school day. They are also not to be at the Junior High or UVCC or in their parking lots unless they attend there or have permission to be there. Students found in these locations are subject to consequences.

### **SENIOR NEWS:**

What you need to do in September:

- Continue to narrow down your college choices to 5-6 schools. Double check admission requirements and deadlines.
- Go on college visits. Seniors are allowed three visits that must be pre-approved by attendance. Permission slips can be obtained in Guidance. No visits during October Count Week
- Speak with college representatives during college and career day.
- Make contact with teacher recommenders. You do not want to wait until the last minute. Give the teachers at least 2 weeks notice.
- Check the high school webpage for the latest scholarship listings. There are a few with October deadlines! Students can access scholarships through the individual college websites. Search the college's financial aid pages.
- Retake the ACT <u>www.actstudent.org</u> and/or the SAT <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> You need to upload a photo of yourself for the ACT.
- For those of you that need a transcript, complete a transcript release form and provide your counselor with \$1.
- Attend the Edison College Fair on October 2 from 12:30-2:00. Information and permission slips to follow.
- If you have any further questions, e-mail senior counselor, Mrs. Beth Rosenkranz at <u>rosenkranzb@piqua.org</u> or call the high school Guidance office at 778-4527.
- All PHS seniors who plan to attend any further education after high school will be required to fill out a Piqua Education Foundation Scholarship form. English teachers will assist in this process. These scholarship forms must be completed and returned to the high school counselor or sent to the Board of Education office by March 21, 2014. A late application is not considered!
