 - 2023 Fall Assessment- for the first time this year we are seeing a decrease in the number of students who are not ready for Kindergarten
 - We are getting closer to Pre-Covid readiness numbers
 - Continue to have issues with Chronic Absences
 - Continue to find ways to increase Pre-K readiness
 - Success Bound Update
 - Will continue to work on our Success Bound plan to reflect changes after COVID closures

 - 22 of the 26 programs are at capacity- all of the programs will be full eventually
