- a. Shift into Business program interest to students who are heading to college
 - i. We are working on establishing a Business Pathway for students
- b. Cameron Foster- Graduate in engineering- accepted an internship at Hartzell in engineering
- c. Jade Holscher- has joined the Winans team. Award in their internship program
- 3. Jason Haak and Tony Trapp
 - a. Lt. Governor Husted visited UVCC for In-Demand jobs week
 - i. Students have made over \$2,000,000 in pre-apprenticeships
 - ii. Career Center facilities in Ohio state budget- \$200 million in expansion and \$100 million in equipment. UVCC has applied for this grant
 - 1. 172 not able to accept next year- this grant will help to expand opportunities for these students
 - 2. 20 of 26 programs are now over-enrolled
 - 3. 3800 students are enrolled in satellite programs through UVCC
 - a. More satellite teachers than on-campus
 - iii. Free STNA training over the summer- summer learning opportunities grant covers the cost of this
 - iv. Camp Excel
 - 1. 15 years for this camp
 - 2. 4th-7th graders in this camp
 - 3. 70 plus students registered for this
 - 4. STEM programs, Rockets
 - 5. June 5-9; 9:30am-2pm
 - v. Opportunity Knocks camp
 - 1. Help to engage students who are at-risk
 - 2. Invite only- try to re-engage them in summer learning opportunities
 - vi. UVCC Convocation- May 25, 2023
 - 1. At Hobart
 - vii. UVCC Foundation Board
 - 1. Visioning with the Hodge Group and Endowment Campaign
 - a. Would like to work at creating an endowment fund for those working to go into the work force
