
Piqua Education Foundation Awards over \$300,000 Academic Scholarships

Lifetime Scholarship awards over \$5 Million Dollars to Piqua High School Graduates

Piqua, Ohio – From accounting and culinary arts to pre-med and political science the Piqua Education Foundation **Scholarship Recipients for 2021-2022** are continuing their educational journeys towards rewarding careers. This year the Piqua Education Foundation, PEF, is excited to award **159 Piqua High School Class of 2018-2021 graduates over \$300,000** in funds to help them achieve their goal of post high school education.

Since 1985, the Piqua Education Foundation (PEF) volunteer Board of Director lives their mission of enhancing the educational opportunities of Piqua City School students, graduates, and staff through securing and distributing contributions from the community.
