What's all the Buzz About?

It is 8 a.m. and the room is buzzing with energy and excitement. This is how it was every Wednesday morning during the Piqua Safety Services levy campaign when a group of concerned citizens gathered. Each week the table was full with eager-faced citizens that believed in their community.

Once the Levy passed and the campaign ended, these citizens continued to meet, because they felt their work was not done and actually in many ways had just started. It was decided to meet on a monthly basis to "champion causes," take on special projects, and address urgent community needs. Believing that we can help Piqua be a better city, Citizens for a Better Piqua came into being.

Some of the work we have focused on...

- We looked at the heroin problem here in our community and invited The Salvation Army, Miami County Recovery Council, & Tri-County Board of Recovery to share their insight and knowledge.
- We have discussed needed legislation for Second-Hand & Pawn Shops, which would force owners to return stolen property.
- We helped City of Piqua Employees Nikki Reese and Rhonda Meckstroth- launch a free CO2 detector project.
- We were instrumental in encouraging a young citizen, Levi Harrison, paint the Gazebo and clean up the area around it
- We adopted the Gazebo and park area through the "Adopt-a-Park" city program and now members of our citizens group take time each week to sit and oversee this wonderful part of our community.
- We held a "Peace & Prayer" vigil on May 19th at the Gazebo
- We began a monthly "Cookie & A Smile" program, where we pass out free cookies at the Gazebo courtesy of the Scott McDonald Family. This will happen on the

- second Thursday of the month at 4 p.m. We will do this now through October.
- We are planning to sponsor a young adult roundtable discussion to address questions such as: "Why do you live here in our community?" and "What is keeping you from returning here to live?"
- We also are starting a "Pass the Positive" campaign where local citizens, businesses, and non-for-profits will be honored for ways they have contributed positively to our wonderful city.

In May, it was decided to merge the PPP (Positively Promoting Piqua) citizens committee into our committee. So, we are a strong committee that is growing and welcoming new faces all the time. Our most important venture is to be a positive voice here in our community, celebrate our community's successes and work in every way we can to make Piqua the best that it can be. We are moving forward, my friends! It is an exciting time to be here in Piqua. A quality life is here, right in our very own community, so let's be about celebrating and enjoying each and every moment we have here in this wonderful place we call home! •



DOWN THE RIVER, DOWN A BEERMore than 80 craft beers will be available at the upcoming **Down the River, Down a Beer** event scheduled in Piqua on Saturday, August 22. River activities are planned from 2 to 5 p.m. with the beer tasting "on tap" from 4 to 7 p.m. A popular event, Down the River, Down a Beer is designed to benefit and promote river corridor stewardship along the Great Miami River near Piqua. One hundred and twenty volunteers and over 40 canoes will be involved in the massive clean-up which begins south of Sidney for nearly 16 miles to south Piqua behind the former Bennett School. Rock Piqua's second season returned with a blast and a distinct rock tilt on June 18. The first concert of the 2015 Rock Piqua! lineup presented an evening of rock and alternative rock music, headlined by the creative Columbus group Truslow. Opening the evening's entertainment was New Bremen's Forgery at Best, followed by a compelling show from Shapes and Colors, from Detroit. James Truslow, on keyboards and vocals, led his namesake band in providing a lively headline show featuring an entertaining mix of original music and covers to cap the evening's concert. A crowd of some 1,500 enjoyed the show under pleasant skies.

The Southern Gothic to Head Up July 18 Concert



Piqua's riverfront music series will continue on Saturday, July 18, from 7 to 11 PM at Lock Nine Riverfront Park with a rock-country focus. The headline entertainer will be The Southern Gothic, a country and southern-rock group from Nashville and Atlanta.

The Southern Gothic was formed in 2007. Under the name "Connor Christian & Southern Gothic," they released two studio albums. The 2013 album "New Hometown" sold 5,000 copies in its first week of release, debuting in the Top 20 of the Billboard Top Country Albums chart and at number one on the Top Heatseekers chart. In January of 2014, the band recorded a double-live album entitled "Shuffle & Stomp," as well as its first full-length concert DVD entitled "CCSG Live in Atlanta." The group consists of S. Connor, Jeff Spirko, Rashad Abu-Azzam, Shawn Thacker, and new member Faye Petree on fiddle.

The Miami Valley Cycling Summit hosted by the City of Piqua and its cycling advocacy committee held a most successful summit event on May 28 and 29. The theme was "Cycling Cultivates" whether it is tourism, healthy lifestyles, or economic development.



It is estimated that the attendance at the 2015 Cycling Summit exceeded 400 persons, with an additional 80 persons having attended the VIP Social the evening before. These figures reflect the continued pattern of growth that has been evident with each Summit since the first one took place in 2009.

The highlight was the keynote address of Mayor of Pittsburgh, Bill Peduto, who shared his vision for turning Pittsburgh into a friendlier cycling and walking city. He communicated that 'millennials' are looking to live closer to where they work. They want access to good cycling lanes and the convenience that they can offer. In addition, the city has become a destination for visitors who can now explore the city by bike.

With the next Cycling Summit slated to take place on the campus of Wright State University we expect the attendance figures will be even greater in 2017.
